Days of the school year are numbered consecutively from 1 to 196, excluding the non-contact days for teachers when students are not required to attend. Schools are not open for operation on weekends, therefore these days are not hown.

Semester 12008 commences for students on January 29 and on January 24 for teachers.

STUDENT-FREE DAY: Non-contact (student-free) days for teachers to undertake professional development activities are January 24, January 25, April 14, July 14 and October 20. Teachers are required to be on duty for a further, locally arranged, non-contact day (Ministerial special holiday for students, usually taken in association with a local show).
Permanent part-time teachers not rostered and called in on this additional day must be paid from local school funds.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS: Public holidays, set by the Minister for ndustrial Relations, are proposed only. Gazetted public holidays for a local show are not shown due to diversity of dates across the state.

Public holidays are gazetted by the Department of Industrial Relations in October/November each year.

All other state primary, secondary and special schools will close on December 12.

In 2009, after the Summer Vacation, all state schools will re-open for students on January 27. Teachers will be required to be on duty two working days earlier, on January 22 and 23.
