It seems a natural progression for romantic comedy *The Wedding Singer* to make the leap into stage musical territory. The world fell in love with the film when it hit screens in 1998, and since its 2006 Broadway debut

audiences have re-lived the music, the magic and the mullets time after time.

Although this is a new show, it is filled with some wonderful and well-known Spotlight talent.

Starring Marc Lyster as Robbie, who was last seen on the Spotlight stage as Mark Cohen in *Rent*, and Spotlight regular leading lady, Kirby Lunn as Julia, well known from her performances in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *SHOUT!* and *Rent*.

SPOTLIGHT THEATRE & WHS REQUIREMENTS

Whatever Happened to Common Sense?

I'm not sure, but it now seems to be called Workplace Health and Safety (WHS)!

Like any other business in the country, Spotlight Theatre has to be compliant with WHS laws. Breach of these laws can result in very heavy fines and the theatre being closed down until the breaches are remedied.

But that's not going to happen to us. Every year we have to undergo a WHS audit, after which we receive an action report on what needs to be attended to and a time frame to do it.... and that's what we have been doing. Over the holiday break the floor of the main stage has been sanded back and resealed (Thankyou George and Michael). Achieving this meant completely stripping all the drapery, fixtures and fittings to prevent dust getting in to them. Ever opportunistic, we took advantage of this to 'Test and Tag' the electrical equipment (basically, the electrical equipment is tested to meet electrical compliance and tagged that they do - Thanks Russell). By Law, we are required to do this every 6-12 months.

All the stage drapery has been cleaned (for the first time in 8 years), repaired, rehung (on chain, we are no longer allowed to use rope) and re-fireproofed. This needs to be done every 10 years, the fireproofing on all of the legs and borders expired 5 years ago! Many other repairs and compliance issues have been done and dealt with.

Why are we telling you this?

Well, as members, you need to know what we

are doing on your behalf. Also, it tends to be the sort of thing nobody really notices despite many hours of thankless work.

We are in the process of compiling Spotlight Theatre's Policies and Procedures. This is basically a list of common sense objectives, but it is a requirement of the WHS laws that we have them, So, next time you see a sign go up in the theatre, or get a request to do some training, that seems like it should be common sense- don't scoff, don't criticise, just smile – it is probably a WHS requirement.

Over the next few months we will be having 3 working bees to clean up areas that need attention and maximise our storage areas. This will also give us an opportunity to catalogue our scenery and props, a utility that Directors can refer to for their shows and other groups can hire from this catalogue.

Now, that is common sense!

The working bees are scheduled for Sunday 8th March – Store under Costume Hire.

Saturday 18th April – Workshop Sunday 17th May – Bio Box/ Props store etc.

We'd like to see you and would appreciate your help, and company, for a few hours.

Remember, this is your theatre. Don't just sit on your bums and complain, help us make it a safer, cleaner and happier environment for us all





Synopsis:

When Mr Pullen goes to the office on Saturday to work on the accounts, he is shocked to discover his employer, Sir Justin Holbrook, in the executive flat with a call-girl.

The unexpected arrival of Lady Holbrook leads Sir Justin to pretend the girl is "the second Mrs Pullen".

....and things get worse! A rich Arab sheik is expected to sign an agreement that is vital to Britain's interests; alas, Sir Justin suddenly collapses, so Pullen has to impersonate him.

....and worse still! The real Mrs Pullen arrives and various others and the situation degenerates into a heady mixture of mistaken identities.

Eventually, as is usual in all good farces and after a riot of fun, everything works out to everyone's satisfaction ... almost!

The title of the play presumably stems from the phrase lie back and think of England, an expression supposedly used in the United Kingdom during the Victorian Era. Traditionally, it was advice given to a woman - usually from a mother to her daughter about to be married. The phrase became popular some decades before the sexual revolution. The assumption was that women were not expected to view sex as pleasurable; instead, women were to view sex as a duty, performed essentially



through passive availability. *The duty is to country, to reproduce and make the country stronger* – therefore, sex was a patriotic duty that women should consider before their own happiness.


The Director will also be seeking understudies for many of the roles.

Auditions will comprise of vocal and music components as well as improvisation and cold read.

Characters:

- Rona Lisa Peretti: The #1 Realtor in Putnam County, a former Putnam County Spelling Bee Champ and returning moderator. She's a sweet woman who loves children but can be very stern when it comes to dealing with Principal Panch, who has feelings for her that she most likely doesn't return. Ms. Peretti herself won the 3rd spelling bee by spelling syzygy which she recounts at the very beginning of the opening number.
- Vice Principal Douglas Panch: After five years' absence from the Bee, Panch returns as judge. There was an "incident" at the 20th annual Bee, but he claims to be in "a better place" now, thanks to a high-fibre diet. He is infatuated with Rona Lisa Peretti, but she does not return his affections.



- *Mitch Mahoney:* The Official Comfort Counsellor. An ex-con, Mitch is performing his community service with the Bee, and hands out juice boxes to losing contestants.
- Olive Ostrovsky: A young newcomer to competitive spelling. Her mother is in an ashram in India , and her father is working late, as usual, but he is trying to come at some time during the Bee. She made friends with her dictionary at a very young age, helping her make it to the competition.
- William Barfée: A Putnam County Spelling Bee finalist last year, he was eliminated because of an allergic reaction to peanuts. His famous "Magic Foot" method of spelling has boosted him to spelling glory, even though he only has one working nostril and a touchy personality.
- Logainne Schwartzandgrubenierre: Logainne is the youngest and most politically aware speller, often making comments about current political figures, with two overbearing gay men as parents. She is a bit of a neat-freak, speaks

with a lisp, and will be back next year.

- *Marcy Park*: A recent transfer from Virginia. Marcy placed 9th in last year's nationals. She speaks six languages, is a member of all-American hockey, a championship rugby player, plays Chopin and Mozart on multiple instruments, sleeps only three hours a night, hides in the bathroom cabinet, and is getting very tired of always winning. She is the poster child for the Over-Achieving Asian. She is also not allowed to cry.
- *Leaf Coneybear:* The second runner-up in his district, Leaf gets into the competition on a lark: the winner and first runner-up had to go to the first runner-up's Bar Mitzvah. Leaf comes from a large family of former hippies and makes his

- own clothes. He spells words correctly while in a trance. In his song, "I'm Not That Smart", he sings that his family thinks he is "not that smart" but insinuates that he is merely easily distracted.
- *Chip Tolentino* ("Tripp Barrington" in the original workshop, "Isaac 'Chip' Berkowitz" in the Chicago production): A boy scout and champion of the 24th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, he returns to defend his title, but he finds puberty hitting at an inopportune moment.






ate Tardy's January Holiday Entertainment was extremely popular and an additional show had to be put on to cater for the crowds.

If you want to learn from the best, make new friends and get the opportunity to work in a real working theatre, then this is the place to be.






