My name is Mrs. APPLICANT, PASSPORT NUMBER, and I currently live in ADDRESS with my husband SPONSOR.

On the 25th December 2014, I married the love of my life, Mr. SPONSOR, a British citizen with passport number: PASSPORT NUMBER. Currently my husband and I are living together in ADDRESS and have done so since February 2014. I am writing this letter to express our desire and need to be together and how we hope to spend the rest of our lives together in the United Kingdom.

We first met on the 5th June 2012; SPONSOR was living and working in Tokyo, Japan as a game designer and took a trip with some friends to Yamanaka, Japan. We met and instantly became friends and continued to meet as friends for the next few weeks until we began dating the month after. We officially started living together around April 2013 in Tokyo.

For Christmas 2013, me and SPONSOR went back to the UK together for two weeks to visit his friends and family and spent the time staying with SPONSORS friends in London, and his family in a small cottage next door to his grandparents house in Norwich. This trip allowed me to grow closer to SPONSORS family and they were very welcoming. SPONSOR and I travelled back from our trip together and returned to Japan on the DATE.

Following our trip to the UK, our relationship continued to grow deeper and SPONSOR visited my family home to meet my family in South Korea. SPONSOR also got on well with my family and was invited to attend my brothers wedding in Seoul, South Korea.

Having met each other's families and being sure that we wanted to be together we decided to move to a larger house just outside of Tokyo at the beginning of 2014, and got married in Tokyo on December 25th 2014. We had already decided prior to getting married that christmas day would make the day even more special, and provide us with the perfect souvenir of our time in Japan, and because Christmas Day in Japan is considered a working day, we had no problems registering our marriage. SPONSOR and I have been together for the last six years, four of which can be seen on our "Certificate of Residency" document. Throughout this time we have realised that we have met our perfect partner. We know that we need to be together and look forward to being able to continue our lives together in the UK.
