## **Reasons for Decision**

Your application has been refused for the following reason(s):

A person applying under section 4C of the British Nationality Act 1981 is expected to meet certain requirements prior to making the application, i.e. you:

- 1. must have been born before 1 January 1983; and
- 2. would have become a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies descent if, before 1 January 1983 women had been able to transmit British nationality in the same way as men, **and**
- 3. Had you been a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies, would have had the right of abode in the United Kingdom and have become a British Citizen on 1 January 1983, **and**
- 4. be of good character.

You have not provided any evidence to confirm that your mother was a citizen of the United Kingdom and colonies (CUKC) at the time of your birth.

We are unable to confirm she was a CUKC as her father and grandfather were both born in British India.

She would not therefore have been able to pass that status on to you. As such, you do not meet the requirement at paragraph 2 above.

As such you do not meet the requirement at paragraph 3 above.

The Secretary of State has therefore refused your application.

Arrangements are being made to return the sum of £80.00 which is refunded in the case of unsuccessful applications where an applicant is not required to attend a citizenship ceremony.

## **Next Steps**

If you believe the decision to refuse your application was not soundly based on nationality law, policy or our procedures and you wish it to be reconsidered, you must complete Form NR and pay a fee.
